Key Indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils



To continue to offer a wider range of activities both within and outside the curriculum in order to get more pupils engaged.	 We will provide our annual 'Wheelie Wicked Week' after positive feedback from staff and pupils. We will provide a 'Drumz Aloud' day across the school after positive feedback last year. Dance, Cheerleading and Gymnastics clubs will be provided throughout the year by specialist coach – Nicola Lawton. Clubs will be offered throughout the year and taught by school staff who show a keen interest in their chosen sport. This includes: Tag Rugby Tennis (Equipment to be bought) Football Netball Quidditch Boccia (Targeted at KS2 children with SEN) This year will have a bigger push for Quidditch club given its success to target typically inactive children – An inter-school competition will also be organised with Childer Thornton PS. Boys and girls will train on separate sides during football club. Invite specialist coaches for sessions with the children and after school sessions – Hoops for health, Whitby Rugby Club. This includes Vara Sports who will be offering after school clubs throughout the year. 	 (See key indicator 2) Drumz Aloud and Quidditch Club have been particularly successful in providing an opportunity to engage those children who are less active in a way that is highly inclusive and is low threat. Drumz aloud was also received hugely well by children and staff alike. Specialist coaching will ensure specialist quality teaching and links to outside clubs that children can join. Boccia club will target KS2 children with SEN and includes a competition in December to engage these children who may be less active and give them the opportunity to represent the school. Separate spaces for boys and girls during football club will provide equal opportunity and will encourage the sport of women's football and remove barriers to participation. Vara Sports has enabled us to provide unique clubs which has targeted children who have previously been uninterested in sport in the past. Greater confidence in KS2 girls to play football and not worry about boys interference. We have been unable to book any specialist coaching this academic year - this will be revisited next year.
